NORDAG Demonstrates K9 Police Officers



Officer Dexter draws Officer Skarban to hidden drugs

The NORDAG or Northcentral Drug Enforcement Group, consists of Forest and Northern Oconto Counties, held a demonstration for the county board, Forest County Sheriff's Department, Circuit Court and District Attorney on how a trained dog helps control the trafficking of drugs in our area.

Mich Ashbeck of the Wabeno and Townsend Police Departments and Todd Skarban of the Oconto Sheriff's Department are the current dog handlers in NORDAG. Officer Skaland and Officer Dexter showed how they can work as a team to find possible narcotics. Officer Skarban informed the group that heroin is on the rise in our area. Marijuana is also used frequently and is a gateway drug to harder drugs.

Officer Dexter is a German Shepard. He is trained to find cocaine, marijuana and methamphetamines. He goes through four to six hours a week training with Officer Skarban. A dog's sense of smell is seven to ten times better than a humans. Officer Dexter demonstrated this by finding a package of drugs under a tv and in a refrigerator. A trained dog will bark, jump or scratch at an area to draw attention from their handler to a certain area. A dog will work on average for five to seven years. They will retire when they start to show problems. A dog will be retired as soon as he presents an ailment that is detrimental to him working. The retired dog will then become a family dog to



Customers win under two PSC rate decisions

MADISON - Customers of several Wisconsin utilities will see some rate relief after the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (Commission) acted on two major rate case proposals today.

Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPSC) customers will benefit from a rate-freeze settlement approved by the Commission unanimously. The utility had originally requested a 9% increase in electric rates, but after a Commission staff audit, the utility and customer groups were able to reach an agreement to avoid an increase for 2013. In addition, WPSC's 2013 retail natural gas distribution rates will decrease in 2013.

Wisconsin Power and Light Company (WPL) customers will see rates go down after the Commission took action on a proposal to decrease retail electric rates by approximately 2.9%, reflecting an estimated \$28.6 million decrease in the variable cost of fuel from current retail revenue requirements.

"I have always welcomed utilities and stakeholders to come forth with new and innovative proposals to give ratepayers some much-needed relief, and these rate-freeze and -decrease plans do just that," said Chairperson Phil Montgomery. "Today's decisions demonstrate the commitment from the Public Service Commission, customer groups, and utilities to keep costs down for Wisconsin ratepayers."

The new rates will take effect on January 1, 2013.

turning our state around, in getting Wisconsin back on the right track, but there is still more work to be done. When elected to the Assembly, I was committed to balancing our state's budget, keeping property taxes low and cutting red tape in government. It's important to me that we don't just balance our budget for one fiscal year; we need to do it every fiscal year.

The Milwaukee Journal Sentinel just reported that during the last year Wisconsin gained over 37,000 jobs and 12,000 of those were in manufacturing. This is great news for Wisconsin and the Northwoods, because it means businesses are willing to invest in Wisconsin where they weren't before. The changes my colleagues and I put in place last year are starting to work and I know that there is still more to be done in Madison. I will be Northern Wisconsin's voice in Madison and ensure that the interests of you and your neighbors are taken seriously.

If elected to the state senate, there are a few things that I would tackle immediately. The first thing I would do is promote the utilization of Northern Wisconsin's natural resources in the form of manufacturing, tourism and forestry. There is an environmentally safe way for us to do this, and as a representative of the north I will make sure that the Northwoods' interests are always kept in mind when it comes to the utilization of our state's natural resources, as well as ensuring that it is done in an environmentally sound way.

The second thing I would do is work on continuing to expand broadband in the north. Once the north has broadband I believe we will be on more equal footing with Southern Wisconsin. With broadband, Northern Wisconsin will be able to compete for jobs and for business. 

Nutrition Facts

Turkey is a great buy during the holiday season. Roast a whole turkey and then use it in sandwiches, casseroles, soups, tacos and other dishes. Turkey can help stretch your food dollars! If you have never roasted a turkey, it may seem difficult. However, it is easy!

Follow these easy steps:

1.) Thaw the turkey in the refrigerator. Be sure to give your turkey enough time to thaw. A 12 pound turkey can take 2 to 3 days in the refrigerator to thaw.

2.) Roast! Place the turkey in a large roasting pan. Add 2 inches of water to the pan. Place in a 350 degree oven. Add more water if needed while it is cooking.

3.) How long should the turkey roast? Use a thermometer. The temperature should reach at least 165 degrees F in the thigh. An un-stuffed 12 pound turkey will need to cook about 3 hours.

Leftover Turkey

Cooked turkey can be kept in the refrigerator for up to 3 to 4 days. Cooked turkey can be kept in the freezer for up to 4 months. Cut leftover turkey into large pieces. Freeze in freezer bags.

•**Turkey Pita** - Combing chopped turkey with low fat mayonnaise and a small amount of pickle relish. Stuff turkey into pita bread. Add shredded lettuce.

Wisconsin deer donation Drop off unwanted deer at Schaefer's IGA!

The Wildlife Damage Deer Donation program will be continuing Wisconsin's autumn tradition. Since the program began in 2000, hunters have donated over 80,000 deer which were processed into over 3.6 million pounds of ground venison.

Wisconsin has a network of venison donation efforts including: Hunt for the Hungry, which operates in the Green Bay area; Target Hunger, which handles donations from the Chronic Wasting Disease Management Zone and the Wisconsin Deer Donation Program, which covers all remaining areas of the state. USDA - Wildlife Services staff also help administer the programs in 49 counties.

Hunters, you can help feed needy people throughout Wisconsin this fall by taking 5 simple steps:

Donate any legally harvested deer taken outside the CWD management zone by dropping it off at a participating processor [PDF] by Friday, February 1, 2013. Deer taken outside the CWD zone are registered with a silver metal tag, and only deer with silver tags may be donated to these processors. Deer taken within the CWD management zone are registered with a red metal tag and must be brought to a participating processor within the CWD management zone [PDF].

Field dress the deer and register it at a Wisconsin DNR registration station prior to donating the deer.

Call First! Contact one of the participating processors before dropping the deer off to verify the processor has space to accept your deer. Some counties with metro deer management units may be accepting deer until the end of the metro unit hunts. Check locally with a participating processor.

Donate the entire deer to receive the processing for free. (Head and/or antlers may be removed for mounting.) Please handle the carcass as if it were destined for your own table. A couple bags of ice placed in the cavity will help preserve the carcass in warm weather.

When dropping your deer off at a processor, please sign the simple log sheet indicating your desire to donate the deer. We'll do the rest. The donated deer will be processed and the venison will be distributed to charitable organizations to help feed Wisconsin's needy.

Hunters please help Target Hunger and the statewide deer donation program "Feed The Need!" Please consider switching to non-toxic ammunition as

even a very small amount of lead in a deer carcass is toxic to humans and wildlife. Page 23 of the Deer Hunting Regulations booklet lists recommendations to reduce the risk of lead in venison and also lists links on where to find copper bullets and non-toxic ammunition for hunting. Thank you for your interest and good luck hunting!



Conservation Programs Available for Farms and Forests

The USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is accepting applications for two of its conservation programs for farms and forestland. The Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) offers technical and financial assistance for a variety of conservation practices on cropland, pasture, and forestland, while the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) offers financial "rewards" for existing conservation on the same land uses. Interested farmers and forest landowners from Florence, Forest, Oneida, and Vilas counties should contact Michael Stinebrink, at (715) 362-5941, Ext. 111, or michael.stinebrink@wi.usda.gov. Alternatively, please visit the Wisconsin NRCS "Programs" webpage (<http://www.wi.nrcs.usda.gov/programs/>) or the USDA Service Center, located at 2187 N Stevens St, in Rhinelander, for more information.

The Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) has offered an average of approximately \$400,000 in flat-rate payments, per year, to farmers and forestland owners, in Florence, Forest, Oneida, and Vilas counties, over the past 3 years. EQIP assistance is offered for more than 80 conservation practices, including fencing, watering systems, and pasture planting for grazing systems; tree planting; invasive species control; manure storage; erosion control; and forest trails and timber stand improvement. Incentive payments are also offered for forest management plans and nutrient management plans. Additionally, EQIP offers funding for wildlife projects, such as wood duck boxes and osprey nesting platforms, in-stream structures for fish habitat, herbaceous and woody plantings for pollinator habitat, and managing forest land to create early successional habitat for woodcock.

The Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) is a "rewards" program that offers payments to land users for being "good stewards" of cropland, pasture, and forestland. All CSP contracts are 5 years in length. The following is a summary of the annual payments for existing CSP contracts, in Wisconsin:

Cropland: \$7 to \$57 per acre (average = \$21/acre)

Pasture: \$3 to \$45 per acre (average = \$16/acre)

Forestland: \$1 to \$25 per acre (average = \$5/acre)

Ideally, land enrolled in CSP should show few signs of erosion, water quality should be protected, and some areas of land should be managed for wildlife habitat. Participants must implement at least one additional conservation measure to earn a payment.

WPS helps fund portion of feasibility study for proposed ORV park

Plan Could Create Significant New Tourism Venue

Wisconsin Off-Highway Vehicle Park Inc. (WORVPI) has commissioned a feasibility study in order to lay the groundwork to create a motorized recreation area in Forest County. The study is intended to determine the best site within Forest County to locate the MRA Park based on accessibility, existing land use, zoning, cost estimates, connectivity and minimal impact to residents and the environment.

Wisconsin Public Service (WPS) announced a \$750 contribution to help support the costs of the study. In presenting the check, Leah Van Zile, Community Relations Leader for WPS stated, "WPS has a long standing tradition of investing in the communities we serve. We hope this puts Forest County one step closer to attaining the MRA Park."

The grant request was written by Forest County Economic Development Partnership (FCEDP). "The potential of a multi-thousand acre park in Forest County certainly fits within our mission," stated FCEDP Secretary Melinda Otto. "It was important to have our executive director invest time to help cover the cost of the study."

Stakeholders that previously announced commitments to supporting the cost of the study included Forest County, City of Crandon, Forest County Tourism Commission, Great Lakes Resource Alliance and the National Off-Highway Vehicle Association, Inc. and Forest County Chamber of Commerce.

and great education they can get in Nicolet's University Transfer Program," said Rose Prunty, Dean of the University Transfer Program, during a report she gave to the Nicolet College Board of Trustees during the Board's October meeting. Today, Nicolet has in place more than 70 credit transfer agreements with numerous four-year colleges and universities. These include many private college and all institutions in the University of Wisconsin System, including UW-Madison, the system's flagship campus.

The sweeping partnership that includes a guaranteed admission agreement with UW-Madison creates a smooth pathway for Northwoods students to study at a world-class university infamous for its high admissions standards, she added.

Furthermore, under the Connections Program, students are enrolled at both Nicolet and UW-Madison and enjoy all of the benefits each institution has to offer. This includes receiving a UW-Madison ID that grants access to UW-Madison libraries, recreational facilities, ability to purchase tickets to UW-Madison athletic events at student rates, and access to cultural and social events on the UW-Madison campus.

When students graduate from Nicolet's University Transfer Liberal Arts Program in good academic standing, they transition to UW-Madison where they are granted full junior status.

In the past five months alone Nicolet has received 230 requests from students to have their transcripts sent to a variety of post-secondary institutions, a necessary step in the transfer process.

"This is a solid indication that many students are continuing their path to a bachelor's degree," Prunty said.

According to the data collected, the most popular destination campuses for Nicolet Transfer students are UW-Stevens Point, UW-Green Bay, and UW-Madison.

Prunty also pointed out that the trend Nicolet's University Transfer Program is experiencing is being mirrored across the country. Nearly half, or 45 percent, of all students who finished a four-year degree in 2010-11 had previously attended a two-year college, said Prunty, citing information from the National Student Clearinghouse.




