Local firearms business victorious in lawsuit against google (aka alphabet inc)

Northwoods Firearms (NWF) located in Crandon wins in court against Google last month after a year of court battles.

Forest County Case Number: 2023sc000098 (Northwoods Firearms, LLC vs Google, LLC) rules in favor of Northwoods Firearms for \$2,469.50 on 6/11/2024.

On 7/21/23 Northwoods Firearms filed suit against Google, LLC for withdrawing \$2000.00 from its bank account but not providing the services that were paid for; Google denied the claim, claiming they cannot provide advertising for firearms businesses, but also would not refund the money.

After several months of attempted communication with Google to try and get the situation handled we decided to take action; Robert Connor owner of Northwoods Firearms- was told that they would not publish ANY adds paid for by NWF due to their "policies" against advertising Firearms. Google informed NWF nothing would be refunded and they would keep the money. It is important to note that the particular ads in mention were not for the sale of firearms, but to promote services offered by Northwoods Firearms to our local areas.

In response Robert stated that the money taken for this specific ad needed to be reimbursed if the ad would not be created and advertised Submitted by Robert Connor

Wild Parsnip in Northern Wisconsin

Wild parsnip (Pastinaca sativa) is an invasive plant species that has been increasingly problematic in northern Wisconsin. Originating from Europe and Asia, it was introduced to North America by early settlers who valued it for its edible root. However, it has since escaped cultivation and naturalized across various parts of the United States, including Northern Wisconsin and Forest

County.



Wild parsnip is a member of the carrot family (Apiaceae) and can be identified by its distinctive features. It typically grows between 4 to 6 feet tall and has a grooved, hollow stem.

The plant produces yellow, umbrella-shaped flower clusters known as umbels, which can be seen from June to late summer. The leaves are pinnately compound, with each leaf composed of multiple leaflets arranged in pairs along a central stalk. One of the most recognizable characteristics of wild parsnip is its yellow-greenish flowers, which differentiate it from the closely related Queen Anne's lace or Cow parsnip, which has white flowers.

Wild parsnip poses significant ecological challenges in northern Wisconsin. It thrives in disturbed areas such as roadsides, fields, and riverbanks, where it can outcompete native vegetation. Its aggressive growth habit allows it to form dense stands, reducing biodiversity by displacing native plant species. This monoculture can lead to a decline in the availability of food and habitat for local wildlife. Furthermore, wild parsnip can alter soil chemistry and hydrology, further exacerbating its impact on native ecosystems.



Summer Uptick in COVID-19

"Preventive measures and vaccinations remain our best tools in combating the spread of COVID-19."

The Aspirus Health Care System has observed a recent increase in COVID-19 cases consistent with trends reported across regions of the country. This increase aligns with nationwide patterns, as warmer months now bring not only heat but also a rise in respiratory illnesses, including COVID-19.





The plant's ability to spread rapidly is facilitated by its prolific seed production. A single wild parsnip plant can produce thousands of seeds, which are easily dispersed by wind, water, and human activity. These seeds can remain viable in the soil for several years, making control efforts challenging and requiring long-term commitment.

Effective management of wild parsnip in northern Wisconsin requires a combination of methods tailored to the specific conditions of an infested area. The most common strategies include mechanical, chemical, and cultural controls.

Mechanical Control: This involves physically removing the plant by cutting, mowing, or digging. Mowing should be done before the plants set seed to prevent further spread. The Forest County Highway Department has been out mowing this month and hopefully is cutting most of the parsnip on the county roadsides. However, mowing alone is not always sufficient, as it can stimulate regrowth if not done properly. Hand-pulling or digging out the roots can be effective for small infestations but is labor-intensive and must be done with care to avoid skin contact.

Chemical Control: Herbicides can be used to manage larger infestations of wild parsnip. Glyphosate and triclopyr are commonly used herbicides that can be effective when applied correctly. It is important to follow label instructions and consider the timing of application to maximize efficacy while minimizing harm to non-target species. In Forest County, herbicide treatment is done mainly in cooperation with Wild Rivers Invasive Species Coalition (WRISC). They are responsible for Forest and Florence Counties in Wisconsin and Iron and Dickinson County in Michigan.

Cultural Control: Promoting the growth of native vegetation through reseeding and restoration efforts can help prevent wild parsnip from re-establishing. Maintaining healthy, competitive plant communities can reduce the likelihood of wild parsnip colonization.


`Wild parsnip poses a significant health risk to humans due to its phototoxic sap, which contains chemicals called furanocoumarins. When the sap comes into contact with the skin and is subsequently exposed to sunlight, it can cause a condition known as phytophotodermatitis. This results in severe skin

irritation, blistering, and discoloration, which can last for several weeks and sometimes leave long-term scars. It is crucial for individuals working in infested areas to wear

protective clothing, including gloves and long sleeves, to minimize skin exposure.


